



What are we doing in coming year?






- We will release 2 versions of glibc.

  - Patch review!






- Patch review challenge:

    - · No sleep.






- Patch review:

  - Long way to go to 100.






Patch review:






- Sustainable patch review for 2.32?

  - Always by-hand inspection to give "Signed-offby:"
  - Answer: Nope.




- Patch review?
  - Weekly
  - Two timezones
  - Use patchwork
  - Make it smooth
  - Involve the community





- Patch review?
  - Integrate patchwork into buildbots to get CI?
  - Want to know if patch builds
  - Want to know testsuite results with patch






- Patch review before bug review?
  - Patches are more valuable.
  - Fix immediate problems.
  - Engage the community.
- Eventually we need bug review.
